Mohawk Valley Jewish Hall of Fame

The Mohawk Valley Jewish Hall of Fame recognizes those Jews with a connection to our region whose contributions to the Jewish people of the Mohawk Valley, the United States, or the world are notable, significant, or otherwise deserving of such recognition. Today we honor the second ever member of this body:

Frank J. Basloe

Frank J. Basloe was born in 1887 in Austro-Hungary and immigrated to the United States at the age of 4. His father did not read or write English and when he opened a store in Herkimer, the sign maker wrote his name as Joe Basloe instead of Josef Breslau, and thus the family name was changed.

As a young boy, Frank Basloe discovered Basketball, a very new sport that was being played in Herkimer. In 1903, at age 16, he became a basketball promoter. He owned and occasionally

played on various teams

throughout upstate New York and as far west as Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, and in 1911, his team beat the "unbeatable" Buffalo Germans to become *World Champions*.

He married Rose Rothblum on 12-25-1914, and they had 4 children: Irving, Eleanor, Sheldon and Leatrice.

The various basketball teams Basloe put together played from 1903 to 1923 and traveled 94,800 miles according to his calculations. He wrote a book called "I Grew Up With Basketball" which is still available today, and is a fascinating look at the birth of the sport

and of Basloe's role in the early days of basketball. Basloe went on to become the manager of several local teams and later the president of the New York State Basketball League.

He donated the land that Temple Beth Joseph (named for his father) was built on and was very involved in supporting his hometown of Herkimer. He attended all the High School plays and sporting events, even when his children were not in them, just to support the youth of Herkimer.

Frank J Basloe died in 1966, leaving behind a legacy of hometown support and tzedakah (charity).

We are excited to introduce to you Ethiopian Jewish Chef BeejhymBarhany, who will be sharing her culinary expertise at Jewtica.





